The Funds charge a 2% redemption fee on redemptions or exchanges of fund shares that are made within 15 days of purchase for Global Opportunity Fund and Multi-Asset Opportunity Fund, and within 60 days of purchase for the Scharf Fund. Had a redemption fee been included, returns would be lower. Investment performance reflects fee waivers in effect. In the absence of such waivers, total return would be reduced. Returns assume reinvestment of all distributions. Returns for periods less than one year are not annualized.

*Scharf Investments, LLC, the Fund's Investment Adviser, has contractually agreed to waive a portion or all of its management fees and pay Fund expenses in order to limit Total Annual Fund Operating Expenses After Fee Waiver and Expense Reimbursement (excluding AFFE, interest expense, dividends on securities sold short, taxes, extraordinary expenses and class specific expenses such as a distribution (12b-1) fee or shareholder servicing plan fee) to 0.79%, 0.54%, 0.88% of average daily net assets of the Scharf Fund, Global Opportunity Fund, and Multi-Asset Opportunity Fund, respectively. The Expense Caps will remain in effect through at least January 27, 2023, and may be terminated only by the Board of Trustees of the Trust. The Adviser may request recoupment from the Funds of previously waived fees and expenses for three years from the date they were waived or paid, subject to the Expense Cap. The net expense ratio represents what investors have paid as of the prospectus dated 1/31/2022.
